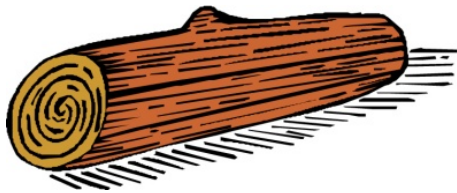

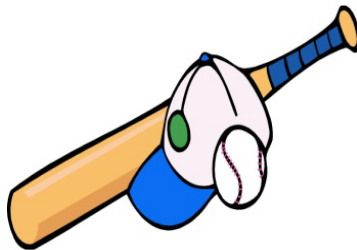

Why this book is good

- The memorisation of word shapes is a vital part of being able to read fluently and spell accurately.
- Visualisation means being able to not only see letters and words in the mind's eye, but hear them as well. This is called audibility. Widely spaced characters help this process
- **Simple and easily recognised words previously studied orally and aurally are used in this first writing exercise. (Wall-mounted whiteboard panels are ideal for ease of use and instant teacher monitoring.)**
- Handwriting tool management and letter formations would have been already demonstrated, discussed and practised many times before memorised spelling is introduced.
- The best and only test assessment that proves that thorough learning has been achieved is 100% accuracy for everyone.
- Visualising words (orthography), as a result of many previous word discussions, lock in mental images of words whether or not they have meaning. This particularly applies to sight words.
